CLEAR ROUND

Maximum height of fences – 0.30m

One round class with rosettes presented to all clear rounds.

BEGINNERS

Class 1 –Senior
Class 2 – Junior

Maximum height of fences – 0.40m (no fillers or spreads)

All clear rounds will go forward to jump off against the clock. Rosettes to 6th place.

MINIMUS

Class 3 –Senior
Class 4 – Junior

Maximum height of fences in round one – 0.50m

All clear rounds will go forward to jump off against the clock over a raised course of maximum height 0.55m. Rosettes to 6th place.

NURSERY NOVICE

Class 5 –Senior
Class 6 – Junior

Maximum height of fences in round one – 0.60m

All clear rounds will go forward to jump off against the clock over a raised course of maximum height 0.65m. Rosettes to 6th place.

NOVICE

Class 7 – Senior
Class 8 – Junior

Maximum height of fences in round one – 0.70m

All clear rounds will go forward to jump off against the clock over a raised course of maximum height 0.75m. Rosettes to 6th place.

INTERMEDIATE

Class 9 – Senior
Class 10 – Junior

Maximum height of fences in first round – 0.80m

All clear rounds will go forward to jump off against the clock over a raised course of maximum height 0.85m. Rosettes to 6th place.

SMALL OPEN

Class 11 –Senior
Class 12 – Junior

Maximum height of fences in first round – 0.90m

All clear rounds will go forward to jump off against the clock over a raised course of maximum height 0.95m. Rosettes to 6th place.

OPEN

Class 13 –Senior
Class 14 – Junior

Maximum height of fences in first round – 1.00 m

All clear rounds will go forward to jump off against the clock over a raised course of maximum height 1.10m. Rosettes to 6th place.

Fife Riding Club – General Rules

1. The Organisers reserve the right to cancel, alter advertised times or refuse entry where necessary.
2. The competition will be run under British Riding Club Rules (Official Rules – 2024).
3. It is a condition of entry that: -
 - a) All competitors must comply with stewards/judges instructions at all times.
 - b) Any person, when mounted, must wear a riding hat to the minimum standard (see below) and that it be securely fastened at all times
 - c) Horses must not be exercised, warmed up, cantered or galloped in the horsebox/car parking area.
 - d) Horses must not enter any area designated a safety zone.
Infringements of these rules will incur elimination.
4. **FRC Members:** In order to qualify for the discounted entry fee the competitor must be a member of Fife Riding Club. For the avoidance of doubt, the term "member" denotes a fully paid up RIDING, HONORARY or ASSOCIATE MEMBER of Fife Riding Club only.
5. Riders/competitors arriving unaccompanied should advise the Secretary. They should be prepared to give a name & phone number of a responsible person who will act on their behalf in the event of an accident etc.
6. Please ensure that all litter and general debris, i.e. drink cans, bandage tapes, straw, etc. are disposed of tidily or taken home. Please note that the field where horseboxes etc are parked is normally used for grazing horses. Would you please ensure that you remove any dung produced by your horse.
7. The judge's decision is final. Arguing with the judges or other officials will lead to disqualification.

Dress Code:

Hats Hats which meet the standards below must be worn with a harness properly adjusted and fastened. Skull caps must be worn with a silk. All Hats must be tagged with a pink tag from BRC, PC or BE. Fixed peaks are not permitted in any competition where cross-country is involved but are permitted for dressage and show jumping.

British PAS 015: 2011 provided they are BSI Kitemarked or Inspec IC Marked VG1 01.040: 2014-12 provided they are BSI Kitemarked or Inspec IC Marked

European EN1384: 2023 provided they are BSI Kitemarked or Inspec IC marked Section 2

American ASTM F1163: 2004a or 04a onwards provided they are SEI marked and SNELL E2016 or 2021 onwards

Australian and New Zealand AS/NZS 3838: 2006 onwards provided they are SAI global marked

Body Protectors

A body protector is obligatory in all cross-country competitions and is strongly recommended in show jumping competitions. A BETA Level 3 displaying a Blue 2018 Label must be worn in competitions where a body protector is obligatory. From 1 Jan 2024, the BETA 2009 Purple Label will no longer be accepted. The ONLY exception to this requirement is that the Exo Body Cages will continue to be accepted, provided they have a BETA Level 3 Purple 2000 Label – the secretary must be notified so they can inform the paramedic they need an allen key.

Jodhpurs and Breeches

White, cream, beige, black or any muted colour of breeches or jodhpurs may be worn.

Boots

Long riding boots designed for riding are to be worn. Short riding boots with gaiters of the same leather and colour may be worn. Suede half chaps may be worn providing they are of identical colour to the boots and have no decoration or tassels of any sort.

Jackets and Shirts

Competitors may choose to ride without jackets. Competitors can wear a fitted waistcoat in any conservative colour in a muted tone and should not be brightly coloured or have bold patterns, subtle pinstripes are permitted as are colours and contrast piping to collar, lapels, pockets and vents. A suitable long or short sleeved shirt of a solid colour is to be worn. Service dress is permitted as is a tweed jacket with a coloured stock or collar and tie. White stocks, white American collar or white shirts with collar and tie may be worn. At the discretion of the Official Steward, competitors may be permitted to ride without jackets or waistcoats in excessively hot weather. An American collar, correctly fastened stock or a suitable shirt that fastens at the neck with a tie must be worn. Suitable short sleeved shirts of a solid colour may be worn. Waterproof coats may be worn in wet weather.
